

[Six Factors for Picking Tubal Reversal Clinics](#)

As we have stated in other articles, every year many, many women change their minds about the sterilization procedure they had and now want a tubal reversal. Thus begins their search for which of the tubal reversal clinics available will be the best one for them. Whether you want a tubal ligation reversal so you have a good chance at having another child or you want one for relief of post tubal ligation syndrome (PTLS), you need to look for the best place to have the procedure.

Start with looking for a clinic that does only tubal reversals. After all, as one doctor told his patient, if you had cancer, you would want to go to a clinic that specialized in only cancer and didn't do several other things as well. It's a matter of focus. It's also a matter of what else they will try to get you to do instead. Face it, with a 30% success rate per cycle, an in vitro fertilization, IVF, just may not be your best chance. Most likely you will have to do more than one cycle and each will cost. Even if your insurance covers some of it you will be picking up part of the tab. Of course, this all depends upon your personal situation. Just like anything else, a tubal reversal is not right for everyone who wants to untie their tubes.

You will most likely also want to know something about how the clinic is accredited. Who has done the accreditation? Does the clinic even have one? Is it licensed to operate as a business? Can you easily find all this information on a website or a brochure from the clinic?

Among all the tubal reversal clinics you check out, what is the reputation of the doctors and staff? Do you have ways to check and see how happy or unhappy patients and potential patients are with the care they have received? Do people highly recommend the services of the clinic you are researching? Even after surgery, how does the clinic treat its former patients? How about during the procedure? Do they even respond to you when you ask them questions? Some clinics that women have asked questions of don't reply for days and weeks, if ever. Check their reputation online.

Of course, the clinic isn't actually the one doing the surgery. What is the reputation of the surgeon from this tubal reversal clinic? How was he or she trained and educated? How many of these surgeries has he done in the last couple years? Does he have a good reputation among his patients? Do they say nice things about him? Does he respond to questions from patients or make sure someone does?

What about the statistics covering the success rates after tubal reversal at each of the tubal reversal clinics you are considering? Can you find those easily? I'm not talking about the overall statistics for all tubal reversals but those for each individual clinic. Do they even keep track of the type of things that matter? Among these will be whether or not your tubes were cauterized or clipped or whatever, how the length of the tubes left affect successful outcome, and even how the age of the patient affects the outcome.

Last, you need to consider the price of a reversal procedure at the clinics you are looking at. Chances are you will have to pay for the surgery, so I know price is a factor. But don't let it be the sole determining factor. Use the answers you come up with from the questions above to help you make up your mind.

Using all the above, and the other things you will find as you search through the tubal reversal clinics, you should be able to make a better choice as to which will be the right one for you. Just take some time and get your answers. If you can't find out what you need to about one of the clinics, it's probably best to just move on to another.
